

# TRILOGY LACROSSE®

## NorCal Ascent Game Play + Rules + Policies: 2024 2025 – 2031/32 Divisions

Games will be played under Girls NFHS rules with the following modifications and points of clarification.

**Format:** 12v12

**Game Time:** Two 20-minute running halves. 3-minute halftime. Kept on central horn

**Timeouts:** One 45-second timeout per game. Game clock does not stop, but penalty time does stop. Cannot be called in last 4-minutes of the game.

**Checking:**

- **All High School Divisions** = NFHS/USAL Full Checking
- **2029/30 Divisions** = USAL Transitional Checking
- **2031/32 Division** = USAL Modified Checking

**Self-Start:** Improper self-starts will be re-set without penalty. False starts in the CSA will be penalized. Self-start is permitted in the final two 2-minutes of game play due to running clock.

**8-meter/ End of Period Play** – Direct Free Positions in the CSA will be played out if time expires in the half or game. The play is over once one of the following occurs: the ball carrier shoots on goal or the ball carrier makes one pass that results in a shot on goal. In all other shooting situations, the goal will stand if a shot is released prior to the horn.

**Penalties:** All major fouls will be time serving penalties and the offending team will play short. The penalty clock will begin when the official blows the whistle to restart play. Penalty time will be kept by the field marshal and will stop if a team uses a time-out. All yellow cards will be 2 minutes, and all red cards will be 4 minutes.

- 1 Yellow Card: Player sits 2-minutes, field marshal keeps time.
- 2 Yellow Cards: Player sits the remainder of game and can play in next game.
- Red Card (Player): Player must sit remainder of game AND must sit out for the next game.
- Red Card (Coach): The coach must leave the game and remain away from the game until finished. They will not be able to coach the rest of the day at the event.
- The offending player that receives a card must serve the penalty time unless it is the goalie, and no substitute is available. If the goalie receives a red card, then they will be ejected from that game and the next. Their team may add an extra field player to the game to play in the field while a replacement goalie is dressed and enters the field through the sub area. No field player may enter the goal circle unless instructed by the officials.
- If a team receives 4 Cards, they will play down the remainder of the game. Exception: For OT Braveheart a team will be allowed to start with 3 field players and a goalie. They do not have to play down unless they receive an additional card during OT.

**Offsides:** Each team may only have 7 field players in the portion of the field with the ball (offensive or defensive ends) unless the team is playing short due to a penalty card or short roster. If a team elects to not play with a goalie, they may have an additional field player in their defensive end.

**Player Equipment:** By participating in this event coaches are certifying that their players are properly equipped for the level of play per NFHS/USAL rules.

**Stick Checks:** No Stick Checks unless requested by the opposing coach before the next draw. No stick checks are permitted in the last 4 minutes of a game. Officials may still conduct check sticks if they suspect an issue.

**Goalies: Player equipment:** please refer to USAL Guidebook for 14U and 12U and the NFHS rule book for HS. Shin guards are optional for HS goalies.

**Alternate Possession:** First AP is awarded to the team listed first on the Field Marshal clipboard and will continue into overtime.

**Deputies:** Not Permitted in 2029/30 (14U) and 2031/32 Divisions

**Overtime Rules (OT):**

- Pool Play: No Overtime
- Playoff Games (non-championship): Tie Games at the end of regulation will immediately go into a 4v4 Modified Braveheart (3 field + 1 goalie) until a goal is scored. Goalies cannot go over the midline unless a player stays back. Play will begin with a draw and then continue until a goal is scored. Substitutions are allowed. The penalty card count

will carry over to OT however to make the Braveheart situation more equitable the team will start with 3 field players and a goalie. If they receive a subsequent card, they will play down according to NFHS rules. Any player who has received 2 yellow cards or a red card will not be eligible for OT per NFHS rules.

- **Championship:** Regular 12v12 game play in 5-minute periods until a goal is scored beginning with a draw, cards and AP carry over. No coin toss.

## SPORTSMANSHIP POLICY

Trilogy Lacrosse has a zero-tolerance policy for the following actions, and they may result in ejection from the tournament at the discretion of the tournament director:

- Fighting, verbal abuse or antagonization of officials or event staff by a player or spectator
- Any player who leaves the sideline, or runs from the opposite end of the field, to participate in an altercation.
- ANY actions deemed excessively unsportsmanlike by a player, coach or fan including but not limited to any discrimination based on gender, religion, race or sexual orientation.

## AGE & ROSTER POLICY

- Every participant must submit an online waiver prior to the tournament in order to participate.
- Players cannot play for more than one club program during the same tournament.
- Players may move up to play in an older age division team within their own club.
- Players cannot play in a division younger than their High School grad year/ USA Lacrosse age designation.
- Any exemption to this policy must be submitted in writing to the tournament director prior to the tournament. Violation of these regulations may result in forfeiture of games at the discretion of the tournament director.
- The tournament director makes the final decision on any roster issues.

## ATTENDEE POLICY/FACILITY RULES

All attendees are expected to adhere to the following policies. Visit <https://mhosc.org/policies> for additional details.

- **Pets are not permitted except for service animals with proper identification. (STRICTLY ENFORCED)**
- **No alcohol or smoking** on the premises.
- **No glass including bottles permitted on the premises.**
- Attendees should adhere to parking signage and follow instructions of the parking staff.
- Parking on-site is managed by the facility staff, there is a \$10/day entrance fee to enter the lots. Please adhere to no parking areas on the map. Cars parked in no-parking areas will be towed by the city at owner's expense.
- **Team Tents:** Only set up in designated areas and never on the end line of a playing field regardless of netting.
- **Turf Field Policies:** No food or drinks allowed on field other than water.
  - No spectators on turf, only Teams and Team Officials · No chairs on turf, use bleachers

## WEATHER POLICY & SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENTS

**All schedule changes will be messaged through Tourney Machine**

- In the event fields become unplayable or unsafe weather conditions occur such as rain, wind, lightning, or excess heat tournament organizers reserve the absolute and unfettered right to:
  - Cancel and/or postpone play.
  - Reduce game times or revise the schedule.
  - Interrupt, suspend, finish or end games early.
  - The field and facility owners, not tournament organizers, have final say whether the tournament will take place in whole or in part.
- In the event there is a lightning strike within 8 miles of the facility, five (5) air horn blasts will signal **families to take shelter in their cars** and await further instruction. Updates will be available through the Tourney Machine App. Standard lightning delays are 30 minutes from the last strike. In the event another strike occurs during the initial delay that 30-minute clock resets.

## COVID-19 POLICY
